ABSTRACT

Aristotle's words from the Foreword to *De anima* on the nobility of the science of the soul (or Psychology) opened a debate among the Scholastics. Suárez's contribution to this discussion gives clues to reflect on the scientific status of Anthropology, and invites a dialogue with modern philosophy (Descartes, Kant) and contemporary philosophy (Tugendhat, Nagel, Spaemann, and others philosophers).
