UPSA GAINS THREE NEW EUROPEAN PROJECTS

The Direction of International Relations has won two new Erasmus projects: Key Action 103 and Key Action 107. These Key actions form part of the Erasmus Programme.

The objectives of Key Action 103 are: encouraging innovation and European dimension in the academic mobility programmes among the Member States of the EU; promoting language learning, diversity and language proficiency; enhancing a sense of European citizenship, based on the comprehension and respect for human rights and democracy; fostering tolerance and respect towards other nations and cultures.

Key Action 107 aims to promote mobility between Higher Education Institutions of Erasmus Programme countries and Higher Education Institutions of associated countries, the latter are the countries that do not form part of the Erasmus programme, such as:

- Western Balkans: Albania, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, Serbia.
- Countries of Eastern Europe: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldavia, Territory of Ukraine recognized by international law.
- Countries of the southern Mediterranean:
 Algeria, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya,
 Morocco, Palestine, Syria, Tunisia.

- Russian Federation: Territory of Russia recognized by international law.
- Asia: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, China, North Korea, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, the Maldives, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam.
- Central Asia: Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan.
- Latin America: Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay, Venezuela.
- South Africa
- Industrialised America: Canada, the United States.
- Industrialised Asia: Australia, Brunei, Hong Kong, Japan, South Korea, Macao, New Zealand, Singapore, Taiwan.

Both actions aim to encourage the transnational cooperation in the field of quality guarantee in any European education and training sector. The total sum of both projects amounts to 185.000 Euros.



Research Project Jean Monnet:

The European Commission has awarded a research grant to the project entitled *«The Reconfiguration of the EU presence in Latin America (EUinLAC)»*. The goals of the project are: promoting teaching on the EU in face of scepticism; raising awareness on the real presence of the European Union in Latin America; linking European and Latin American institutions.
